Aspirational District Programme in Assam

Aspirational District Programme (ADP) was launched in January 2018 by NITI Aayog, Govt of India with an aim to quickly and effectively transform the identified Aspirational Districts. Govt of India identified 115 districts which includes 7 districts of Assam i.e. Barpeta, Baksa, Darrang, Dhubri, Hailakandi, Goalpara, and Udalguri.

Identification of Problem Areas

- Problems areas identified based on the shelf of schemes/activities prepared under the purview of the approved District Action Plan (DAP) with specific reference to the 49 KPIs and 81 data points endorsed by NITI Aaayog.
- This shelf of schemes is prepared by Deputy Commissioner/ Principal Secretary-BTR in consultation with district heads of line departments and the State Prabhari Officer of the concerned district.
- The district authorities also seek the help of agencies like UNDP, UNICEF, Central Prabhari Officers, and the NGOs partners/consultants entrusted by NITI Aayog in developing the shelf of activities/schemes based on identified needs and gaps in the district.

Resolutions

- [•] The real time data collection in regular periodic intervals helps to evaluate and measure the progress on the ground and identify the gaps.
- [•] The State Government has initiated action for adopting exponential approach to develop the aspirational districts of the State at par with the other developed districts of the State as well as of the Country.
- [•] The initiative is supported by prestigious partners in programme implementation which provide ground level support.
- ^a The knowledge partners of NITI Aayog have deployed staff members to the Districts
- In Assam, the NGO supporters are entrusted to extend support to 5 Aspirational Districts i.e., Barpeta, Baksa, Dhubri, Darrang and Goalpara.
- NEC has provided Rs 1 crore per District for the development of the 7 Aspirational Districts.
- The programme is being reviewed at various level with concerned Deputy Commissioner/ Principal Secretary for BTR in the presence of Central Prabhari Officers to gear up the activities
- During the year 2021-22, Govt. of Assam have released an amount of Rs 560.00 lakh under SOPD @ Rs 80.00 lakh per District to all the seven Aspirational Districts for implementation of the various developmental schemes

Overall Impact & Outcomes

Brief summation of overall impact and outcome under the Aspirational District Programme:

- i. Dhurbi district has topped in the Financial Inclusion parameter among 14 Aspirational districts of the Northeast. It was awarded Rs 3.00 crore based on performance in the months of March-June 2021. It was also ranked 1st in "Agriculture & Water Resources Sector" and 4th in the overall Delta Ranking.
- Udalguri district had secured good rank in the overall Delta Ranking during the months of January -21 & February- 21 for which it was awarded Rs 7.00 crore. It also received Rs 3 crores for its good ranking under the Financial Inclusion and Skill Development parameter for the month of December,2021.
- iii. Baksa district has been awarded 5 crores for good ranking in the Health & Nutrition parameter in FY 2021-22 and Rs 2.1393 crore for securing good rank in the month of December 2021.
- iv. Darrang district has been awarded Rs 1 crore for its overall improvement in Delta Ranking in the months of January -21 & February -21.
